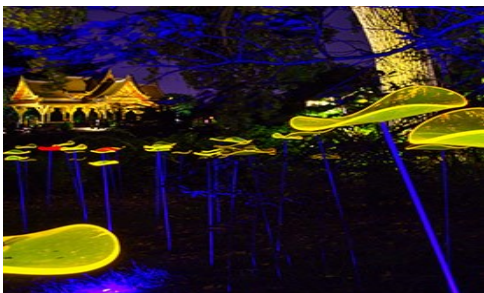
Family Halloween
