Because the national July 4<sup>th</sup> Independence Day holiday **falls** (occurs, happens) on a Sunday this year, UW will **observe** (celebrate) the holiday on Monday, July 5.

UW-Madison leaders are making plans for the fall semester, including:

- Continuing to **offer** (make available) no-cost vaccinations.
- **Transitioning** (changing) many employees from remote to in-person work.
- Not requiring face masks, but **recommending** (suggesting, encouraging) unvaccinated people wear them.
- Returning classrooms and campus spaces to **full capacity** (normal number of people).
- Not requiring employees to test regularly, but continuing to offer no-cost, drop-in testing.

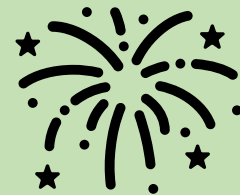
