On December 14, the **Electoral College** (group representing voters in each state) met to select Joe Biden and Kamala Harris as the next U.S. President and Vice President.

There are 538 **electors** (Electoral College members); 10 are from Wisconsin.

Some Americans want to **eliminate** (get rid of) the Electoral College because sometimes its vote is different from the **popular vote** (votes of every person in each state).
