New words of the week:

If you traveled or **gathered** (met in a group) with people who don't live with you over Thanksgiving **recess** (break), you should get tested for COVID-19 before **resuming** (starting again) in-person campus activities.

If you get a negative test immediately after traveling or attending a **gathering** (group meeting), that is NOT an **all-clear** (OK). You should wait 3 to 5 days to test, and then test again after 10 to 12 days.
