Phrases for conversation:

Use these phrases to talk about home.

At home has 2 meanings:

- 1. Be in your house or apartment. Examples:
 - Do you work at home?
 - I am at home every Saturday.
- 2. Feel comfortable. Examples:
 - Do you feel **at home** in Madison?
 - Where do you feel most at home?
 - I feel at home with my friends.

Where do you call home? = Where are you from?

Learn more:

Phrasal verb = verb + preposition that together has 1 meaning. Example: **deck out** = decorate.

You can **create a bubble or pod** (make a small group of people who only have contact with each other).


