

Words with "de":

Here are some words that start with "de" (originally from Latin, meaning **down, off, away, from**):

- <u>Decrease = lower, lessen</u>
 The need for cleaning decreases
 when campus closes.
- **Deduct** = take out, take away from An employer **deducts** taxes from your paycheck.
- Defund = take away money
 Many protestors want to defund police departments in the U.S.
- Deflect = turn away, push aside
 The official tried to deflect the question he did not want to answer.
